Nurses Notes

Alcoholism/ alcohol use disorder

People drink to socialize, celebrate, and relax. Alcohol often has a strong effect on people – and throughout history, we've struggled to understand and manage alcohol's power. Why does alcohol cause us to act and feel differently? How much is too much? Why do some people become addicted while others do not? Here's what we know:

- Alcohol's effects vary from person to person, depending on a variety of factors, including:
- How much and how often you drink, your age, your health status and your family history
- While drinking alcohol is itself not necessarily a problem – drinking too much can cause a range of consequences, and increase your risk for a variety of problems. These include reduced inhibitions, slurred speech, motor impairment, memory problems, breathing problems and even death. Other consequences include auto accidents, risky behavior, violent behavior and suicide or homicide. People who drink too much over a long period of time may experience alcohol's longer-term effects, which can include:

In addition, long-term alcohol use disorder may result in Wernicke-Korsakoff syndrome, a brain disorder due to thiamine (vitamin B1) deficiency. Lack of vitamin B1 is common in people with alcohol use disorder.
