More on Mental Health

There is no shame or embarrassment when living with a mental health condition.

A mental health condition is like any other physical condition. With treatment, most people recover.

Recovery means a person can learn, communicate, work, and participate fully in the community. We sometimes forget this, and expect people to "snap out of it" or "just change their frame of mind." We wouldn't say that to someone who has diabetes or cancer, so why would we say it to someone who has depression?

Some statistics to think about

42 % of people with a mental health condition face stigma and discrimination at least once a month

58% of sufferers say the stigma and discrimination is as damaging as or harder to deal with than the disease.

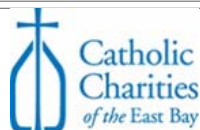
