Nurses Notes

CHOLESTEROL, Cont'

Factors affecting cholesterol levels:

1. Diet: Saturated fat and cholesterol in the food you eat increase cholesterol levels. Try to reduce the amount of saturated fat and cholesterol in your diet.
2. Weight: Is a risk factor for heart disease but can also increase your cholesterol. Losing weight can lower your LDL and total cholesterol levels, as well as increase HDL cholesterol
3. Exercise: Regular exercise can lower LDL cholesterol and raise HDL cholesterol. You should try to be physically active for 30 minutes on most days
4. Age and Gender: As we get older, cholesterol levels rise. Before menopause, women tend to have lower cholesterol levels than men of the same age. After menopause, however, women's LDL levels tend to rise.
5. Diabetes: Poorly controlled diabetes increases cholesterol levels. With improvements in control, cholesterol levels can fall.
6. Heredity: Your genes partly determine how much cholesterol your body makes. High blood cholesterol can run in families.
7. Other causes: Certain medications and medical conditions can cause high cholesterol.

There are no symptoms of high cholesterol. But if you have high cholesterol and other disease risk factors, there can be serious health complications. There is a link between high cholesterol and heart disease, stroke, diabetes, and other health problems. That is why it is important to lower your cholesterol.

Safe Environment Training

The Diocese of Oakland requires all volunteers with regular access to minors and all Liturgical Ministers to be trained in the signs of child abuse, reporting procedures, awareness of the characteristics of child abuse perpetrators and in steps that can be taken to safe guard the children in our care. **Liturgical ministers and volunteers with access to minors are required to be trained at the beginning of their ministry and every 3 years there after. This year all our Liturgical Ministers and all our volunteers with access to minors (Catechists, Catechists aids, Children's Liturgy of the Word teachers, etc.) are required to go through the Safe Environment Training by Oct. 30, 2010.** Onsite training opportunities are available through the Oakland Diocese. A list of onsite training locations can be found at the Diocese's website at www.oakdiocese.org/safe/workshops.htm. **Online training is also available in English and Spanish at the following website www.shieldthevulnerable.org.** If you choose the online training please print your certificate of completion and bring it to the parish office.
