Nurses Notes

CHOLESTEROL, Cont'

High cholesterol increases the risk of other conditions, depending on which blood vessels are narrowed or blocked. These diseases include: Coronary heart disease, Stroke, and Peripheral vascular disease. High cholesterol has also been linked to diabetes and high blood pressure. To prevent these conditions, take steps to lower your cholesterol if it is elevated.

Cholesterol and Coronary Heart Disease: The main risk associated with high cholesterol is coronary heart disease. If cholesterol is too high, it builds up in the walls of your arteries. Over time, this buildup (called plaque) causes hardening of the arteries (atherosclerosis). This causes arteries to become narrowed, slowing blood flow to the heart. Reduced blood flow to the heart can result in *angina* (chest pain) or in a *heart attack* in cases when a blood vessel is blocked completely.

Cholesterol and Stroke: Stroke can result if the blood supply to part of the brain is interrupted. A stroke occurs when a blood vessel that carries oxygen and nutrients to the brain becomes blocked or bursts. When stroke occurs, part of the brain cannot get the blood and oxygen it needs, so it starts to die.

Cholesterol and Peripheral Vascular Disease: High cholesterol also has been linked to peripheral vascular disease, which refers to disease of blood vessels outside the heart and brain. In this condition, fatty deposits build up along artery walls and affect blood circulation mainly in arteries of the legs and feet.

Cholesterol and Diabetes: Diabetes can upset the balance between HDL and LDL cholesterol levels. People with diabetes tend to have a low HDL and high triglyceride levels, both of which boost the risk of heart and artery disease.

Cholesterol and High Blood Pressure: Hypertension and high cholesterol also are linked. When the arteries become hardened and narrowed with cholesterol plaque and calcium (atherosclerosis), the heart has to strain much harder to pump blood through them. As a result, blood pressure becomes abnormally high. High blood pressure is also linked to heart disease.
