role of parents putting their children to bed with parents acting like the children. Or you may have them role play parents asking for cooperation from children to clean up the family room. When the role play is finished, ask if it was an accurate picture of how this situation usually plays out in your household. Does everyone cooperate when asked? What happens when someone doesn't cooperate? How are the conflicts that emerge resolved? Observe that conflicts based on power struggles in situations such as these seem unavoidable in family life. In today's Gospel, Jesus teaches how Christians are to show their authority over others. Read together today's Gospel, Mark 10:35-45. After reading the Gospel, talk with your family about Jesus' unique message to his disciples about how they are to exercise authority. Talk about ways in which you might apply Jesus' words in your family life. Conclude by praying we may receive honor in God's eyes by learning to serve others in love. Nurses Notes

Flu or Cold Symptoms – Part 5

When do I call the doctor with flu or cold symptoms?

If you already have flu or cold symptoms, it's important to call your doctor if you also have any of the following severe symptoms:

Persistent fever: This can be a sign of another bacterial infection that should be treated.

Painful swallowing: Although a sore throat from a cold or flu can cause mild discomfort, severe pain could mean strep throat, which requires treatment by a doctor.

Persistent coughing: When a cough doesn't go away after two or three weeks, it could be bronchitis, which may need an antibiotic. Postnasal drip or sinusitis can also result in a persistent cough. In addition, asthma is another cause of persistent coughing. Asthma medications such as steroids, anti-inflammatory medications, and bronchodilators are necessary to treat asthma.

Persistent congestion and headaches: When colds and allergies cause congestion and blockage of sinus passages, they can lead to sinus infection. If you have pain around the eyes and face with thick nasal discharge after a week, you may have a bacterial infection and need an antibiotic.

In some cases, you may need to get emergency medical attention right away. In adults, signs of a crisis include:

- Severe chest pain
- Severe headache
- Shortness of breath
- Dizziness
- Confusion
- Persistent vomiting

In children, signs of an emergency are:

- Difficulty breathing or rapid breathing
- Bluish skin color
- Not drinking enough fluids
- Lethargy and failure to interact normally
- Extreme irritability or distress
- Symptoms that were improving and then suddenly worsen
- Fever with a rash

Safe Environment Training

The Diocese of Oakland requires all volunteers with regular access to minors and all Liturgical ministers to be trained in the signs of child abuse, reporting procedures, awareness of the characteristics of child abuse perpetrators and in steps that can be taken to safe guard the children in our care. **Liturgical ministers and volunteers with access to minors are required to be trained at the beginning of their ministry and every 3 years there after. If you have never been through training you must complete the course by Oct. 30, 2009.** Onsite training opportunities are available through the Oakland Diocese. Capital Campaign Update

We are very happy to announce that St. Anne has received confirmation from the Valley Foundation approving our request for an extension of the Capital Campaign Matching Fund Program. All contributions to the capital campaign received through December 2010 will now be matched. This gives us an additional fifteen months to reach our \$1 million goal and maximize the matching funds offer. We are rapidly approaching \$800,000 so this is a very achievable goal.
